Cult British filmmaker Peter Strickland, director of Berberian Sound Studio and The Duke of Burgundy, returns with a haunting ghost story set against the backdrop of a busy winter sales period in a department store. In Fabric follows the life of a cursed dress as it passes from person to person, with devastating consequences.

Also screening before the preview is Veronika Voss, the penultimate film by the great German director Rainer Werner Fassbinder, whose elegantly stylised and psychologically complex melodramas have been an enduring influence on the films of Peter Strickland.

INDIs Movie Night: Hedwig and the Angry Inch - Pride Special

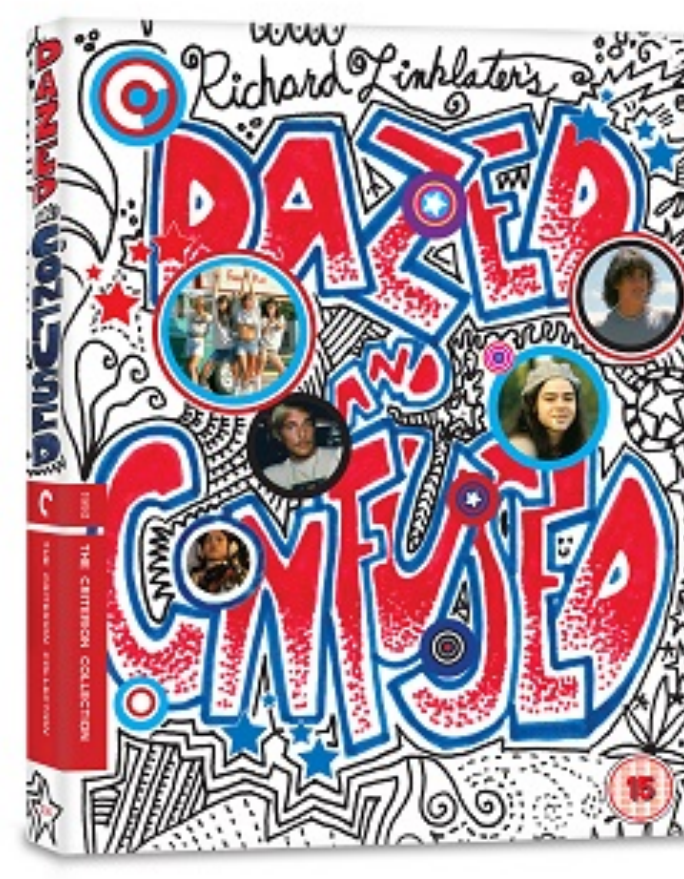

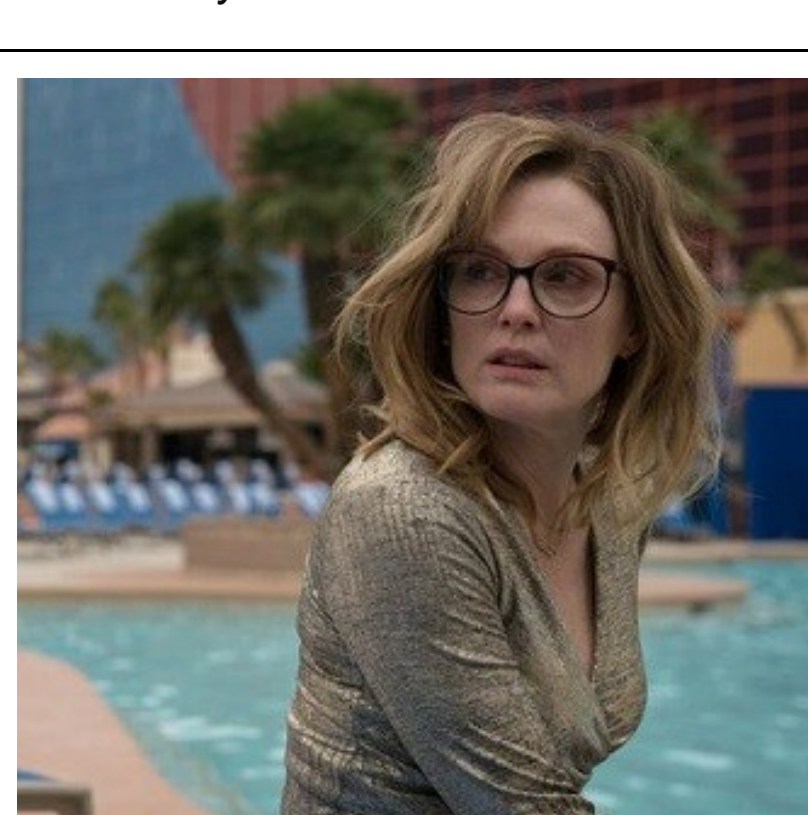

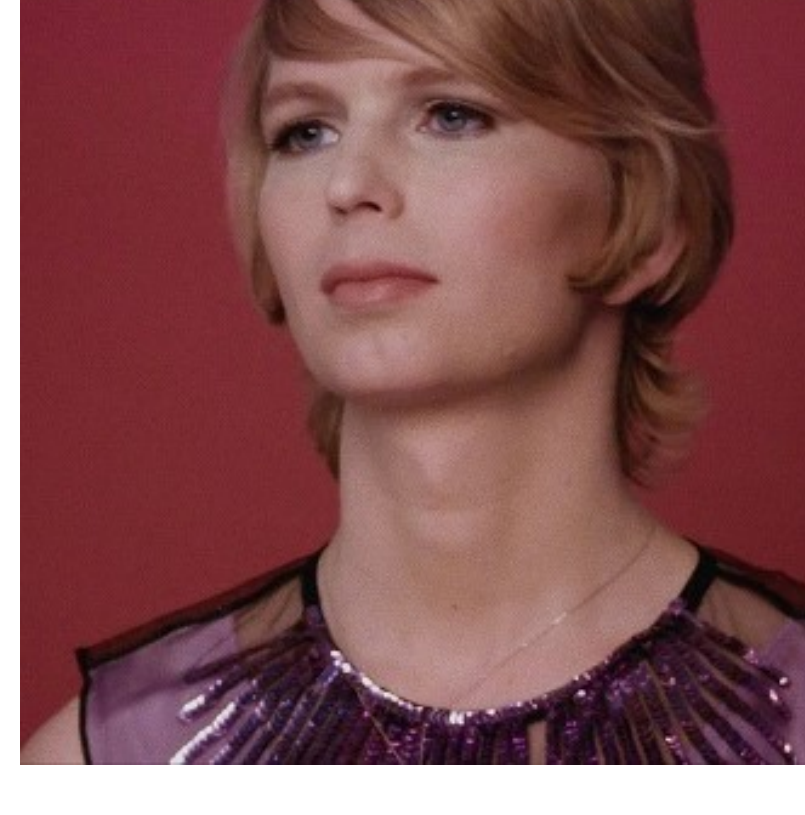
Gloria Bell: Unexpected romance in Sebastian Lelio's mature comedy
